Publication: Accepted and presented papers will be invited for submission to a **special issue of the MANCOSA Journal of Management and Administration** after the conference.

1. Scope & Topics

We invite high-quality, original research papers and practice-based studies that address the cultural, linguistic, and societal dimensions of cybersecurity. Topics include (but are not limited to):

• Cybersecurity in Multilingual Contexts

- o Threat detection and response in multilingual environments
- Cross-language phishing and social engineering
- o AI-based multilingual cybersecurity tools

• Cultural Perspectives in Cybersecurity

- o Cyber norms and ethics across cultures
- o Cultural factors influencing cyber risk perception and behaviour
- Cyber diplomacy and international collaboration

Global Threat Landscape

- o Comparative analysis of regional threat vectors
- Cross-border cybercrime investigation challenges
- o Cybersecurity capacity building in developing economies

Technology and Society

- The role of AI and automation in culturally diverse security contexts
- o Human factors in cybersecurity training across cultures

o Accessibility and inclusion in security technologies

• Policy and Governance

- o International legal frameworks for cybercrime
- o Data privacy regulations: POPIA, GDPR, and beyond
- o National strategies for multilingual/multicultural security

2. Submission Categories

- Full Research Papers empirical or theoretical studies (5,000–7,000 words).
- Case Studies & Practitioner Reports in-depth reports from industry or government (4,000–6,000 words).
- **Short Papers** preliminary findings or position papers (3,000–4,000 words).

3. Submission & Review Process

The conference uses a **two-stage review model**:

1. Stage 1 – Preliminary Review (Pre-Conference):

- o Double-blind peer review to determine suitability for presentation.
- o Accepted papers will be **invited for oral presentation** at THREAT 2025.

2. Stage 2 – Final Review (Post-Conference):

- o Authors revise papers based on reviewer and conference feedback.
- Final manuscripts undergo **double-blind peer review** for journal publication in a special issue.

4. Anonymisation Rules

Authors must submit anonymised manuscripts:

- Remove all author names, affiliations, and acknowledgements from the manuscript.
- Cite your own previous work in the **third person** (e.g., "Smith (2023) showed..." instead of "In our previous work...").
- Remove metadata from the document file.
- Supplementary materials that could reveal identity must be anonymised.

5. Ethical Guidelines

- Submissions must be **original and not under review elsewhere** at the time of submission.
- Authors must adhere to **academic integrity** and avoid plagiarism, self-plagiarism, and fabrication of results.
- Studies involving human participants must follow recognised ethical standards (e.g., informed consent, IRB/ethics approval where applicable).
- Any AI-generated content must be transparently disclosed and used in compliance with publisher guidelines.
